1. Frida Kahlo Museum

This is probably one of the most visited museums in Mexico City, it's definitely worth visiting!

The Palacio de Bellas Artes is a prominent cultural center in Mexico City. This hosts performing arts events, literature events and plastic arts galleries and exhibitions.


If you're a fan of the opera, art galleries or exhibitions you'll love this place.


3. Xochimilco boats

You can also visit their well-known Mercado de Coyoacan if you are craving some authentic street food as well as getting some souvenirs.


5. Bosque de Chapultepec & Chapultepec Castle

7. Teotihuacan Pyramids

You basically wouldn't have gone to CDMX if you hadn't visited these pyramids! Approximately one hour away from the city you can see the emblematic Pyramid of the Sun and the Moon.

You can book a tour while you're there or just walk on your own. They also have a museum with their history.

Note that you can't climb the pyramids anymore

While you're there you can have breakfast/lunch at their beautiful restaurant called: La Gruta. Only a few km away from the pyramids.

A beautiful restaurant inside a cave, where you can eat authentic Mexican food and while you're eating you can enjoy a traditional Mexican folklore dance.

About:


